3		Maritime Plaza	2 acres	This plaza surrounds the Alcoa Building with two single-story structures containing a bank and a restaurant was dedicated for public use in 1968. Built on the roof of the public parking garage, the plaza is connected to Golden Gateway Center and Embarcadero Center by pedestrian bridges.	Privately Owned & Managed.
3		Justin Herman Park	8 acres	Located along the Embarcadero, at the foot of Market Street from the MUNI Turnaround to Washington Street. The park consists of a plaza and a grassy area.	Maintained by Dept. of Rec.& Park
5	Western Addition	Buchanan Green Park	75,000 s.f.	This park and playground serves as a pedestrian walkway and recreational area for the residents of the adjoining family housing.	Maintained by Dept. of Rec.& Park
5		Mary Ellen Pleasant Memorial (mini-park)	3,096 s.f.	Memorial to the "mother of Civil Rights in California," this park contains a decorative sidewalk, eight concrete bollards for seating, and a large ceramic commemorative plaque placed by the SF African-American Historical and Cultural Society. 5		Cottage Row	6,677 s.f.	This small stretch of open space runs north from Sutter Street toward Bush Street in a block bounded by Fillmore and Webster Streets, and provides quiet shaded seating for area residents and complements an adjacent row of Victorian Cottages. 5		GG-Steiner Mini-Park	3,280 s.f.	Located at the corner of Golden Gate avenue and Steiner Street, the park, which has a mural on its rear wall, provides a play area for small children and seating for adults.	Maintained by Dept. of Rec.& Park
5		Beidman-O'Farrell Mini-Park	2,580 s.f.	Located at the corner of O'Farrell and Beideman Place, this park contains play structures for children and seating for adults.	Maintained by Dept. of Rec.& Park
5		Fillmore-Turk Mini-park	9,944 s.f.	Located on Fillmore Street between Turk and Golden Gate Avenue next to the landmark Old Municipal Railway Substation, this park contains play structures a seating area, and a bandstand.	Maintained by Dept. of Rec.& Park

6	Yerba Buena Center (YBC)	East Garden/ YBC	.5 acre	Located between the two Center for the Arts buildings in Yerba Buena Center, this park has a terrace and fountain.	
6		Esplanade/ YBC	6 acre	Among the components of the Esplanade are a 6-acre garden and the Martin Luther King, Jr. Memorial Fountain. The garden enjoys high usage by residents and visitors alike for cultural activities and performances, as well as recreation.	Maintained by SFRA.
6		Interactive Garden/ YBC	?	An interactive play area for children located in the center of Central Block 3 of Yerba Buena Center.	Maintained by SFRA.
10	Bayview Hunters Point	Hilltop Park	3.4 acres	This park, which is located in the center of the project area, includes a playground structures and equipment for children, an amphitheater with a large sculptured metal sundial, paving inlaid with children's artwork, a large circular grassy sitting area for amphitheater audiences and picnic facilities, and a concave skateboard arena. 10		Youngblood-Coleman Playfield	6.7 acres	This recreation area, located at Galvez Avenue and Mendell Street, includes football/soccer and softball fields, basket ball/handball courts with bleachers, tennis/volleyball courts with bleachers, a community facilities building (office, meeting rooms, kitchen and restrooms), a wooden dragon play structure, sidewalk games, picnic and game tables and night lighting. 6	Rincon Point – South Beach	South Beach Harbor Park	5 acres	This waterfront park, which has completed its first phase in 1996, will have flexible urban open space, parking for boaters, and landscaping. The park currently has a 3,000 s.f. play area for pre-school aged children, which was completed in April 2002. Planning is currently underway to complete public improvements for the park and the South Beach harbor, including the completion of the waterfront promenade and public access upgrades.
